Acts 2:4, 12, 14, 16-17 NIV

<sup>4</sup>All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

<sup>12</sup> Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

<sup>14</sup> Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. <sup>16</sup> No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

## Conviction is to the spirit what \_\_\_\_\_\_ is to the body.

Romans 12:9b NKJ

...*Abhor* [to detest utterly, have a horror of] *what is evil. Cling* [to stick to, to glue together] *to what is good.* Acts 2:37b NIV ... and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" ("Brothers"). <sup>38</sup> Peter replied, "Repent...[to change one's mind for the better].

... Then they will make the teaching about God our Savior attractive in every way.

Proverbs 28:13 KJV

*He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.*

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Dr. Michael Brown -

"If I'm reminded of a sin I committed during the day, I'll immediately ask for forgiveness. For the most part, this is an element of my ongoing relationship with my Father. And when I'm conscious of doing wrong, or when I realize my actions or attitudes or words grieved Him, as a beloved son, a fully accepted member of the Father's family, I confess my sin and ask Him to cleanse me, without for a split second thinking to myself, 'I hope I'm still saved!' (Honestly, I can't even relate to that kind of thinking, and my heart really goes out to you if you do think like that. There's obviously something very important about grace that you're still missing.)

"This is beneficial in many ways, since it helps me not to trivialize sin or to deceive myself by allowing sin to grow incrementally, in my heart. I bring my life into the light as a child of the light, and cleansing and forgiveness are applied afresh to my life, as one already forgiven and cleansed."
